Job Summary: Primary duties include overseeing the following departments: Cosmetology, Criminal Justice, Early Childhood Studies, and Law Enforcement Academy. Duties include curriculum development, providing faculty support, evaluating programs, and ensuring compliance with institutional standards, while fostering student success through strategic planning, interdepartmental collaboration, and effective communication with faculty and administration. This leadership role includes evaluating and improving instruction, supporting faculty development, and ensuring high-quality teaching and learning. The Division Chair will facilitate communication across departments, conduct regular meetings, assist with student recruitment, advising, and placement, and represent faculty perspectives to the Dean and other stakeholders. Additional responsibilities include making budget recommendations and planning course schedules in coordination with faculty and the Registrar. The position oversees faculty evaluations, participates in hiring committees, and collaborates with the Professional Development Office and Strategic Innovation & Research on program reviews and planning. The Division Chair will also approve purchase requisitions and support student engagement through registration, recruitment, and advising activities. This role includes resolving initial student and personnel complaints, maintaining master syllabi and textbook adoption processes, and ensuring adherence to institutional and accreditor reporting standards. Active participation in committee work, oversight of faculty maintenance requests, and fulfillment of other duties as assigned by the College President, Vice President of Academic Affairs, or Dean are also required.
